Date syllabus ends	Review Start Date	If formal assessments are completed early, how will students be engaged until the end of the term?
<p>97% of the prepared work is completed by March Break: this includes the IA (20%) and the prepared reading/commentary part of the course (45%).</p>	<p>Integrated review begins after March Break for the prepared reading and commentary part of the course (45%): there are 500+ lines of Latin texts to review for translation. Sight-reading practice and review is ongoing. 35% of the syllabus is sight-reading and students practice this until the end of the April review week, due to the challenging nature of reading a Latin passage from Ovid by sight (with a dictionary). Dictionary, grammar, and vocabulary skills continue to be drilled at the same time.</p>	<p>Paper 1 (35%): Many classes in April will be dedicated to independent sight translation practice. It is critical for students to attend class in April to prepare for this sight Paper 1, with teacher guidance and support. The practice will be based on unseen past exam passages. This sight reading practice will build student confidence and prepare them well for Paper.</p> <p>Paper 2 (45%): Students will complete the prepared reading list during the first week of April. Useful and productive lessons continue throughout April, in the form of reviews for prepared works studied in Y11 and Y12. Students appreciate making valuable use of class time to review, study, and discuss as a group their Latin translations and commentaries. This becomes productive study time that they are engaged in as a group with teacher support.</p>
